Old Testament Reading Deuteronomy 10:12-21

"And now, Israel, what does the LORD your God require of you, but to fear the LORD your God, to walk in all his ways, to love him, to serve the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul, and to keep the commandments and statutes of the LORD, which I am commanding you today for your good? Behold, to the LORD your God belong heaven and the heaven of heavens, the earth with all that is in it. But when the Pharisees heard that he had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together. And one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. "Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?" And he said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets." Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them a question, saying, "What do you think about the Christ? Whose son is he?" They said to him, "The son of David." He said to them, "How is it then that David, in the Spirit, calls him Lord, saying, "The Lord said to my Lord, "Sit at my right hand, until I put your enemies under your feet"? If then David calls him Lord, how is he, his son?" And no one was able to answer him a word, nor from that day did anyone dare to ask him any more questions.

TAKING COMMUNION IN THIS CHURCH

Communing in the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS) means you are First Baptized into the Name of the Father and the Son and The Holy Spirit and you have membership in The LCMS and have been prepared in this Church Body to receive Holy Communion. If you have not been prepared for this, please hold off and talk to Pastor Hoffman after Church. Thank you for respecting our beliefs.

In Matthew 22:34–46, Jesus faces yet another test from the Pharisees. A lawyer asks Him which commandment in the Law is greatest. Jesus answers by summarizing the entire Law: love God with all your heart, soul, and mind, and love your neighbor as yourself. Every commandment depends on these two. But then Jesus turns the tables and asks them a question: "What do you think about the Christ? Whose son, is He?" When they answer, "The son of David," Jesus quotes Psalm 110 to show that the Messiah is not only David's son but also David's Lord—fully human and fully divine. The Pharisees are silenced.

This passage reveals both Law and Gospel: The Law demands perfect love that we cannot fulfill, while the Gospel reveals the One who has fulfilled it for us—Jesus Christ, the Lord of love.

Because Christ has loved us perfectly, we are free to love God and our neighbor joyfully. Let His love flow through you this week—in humility, forgiveness, and mercy—so that others may see in you the living reflection of your Lord's redeeming love.

Psalm 34:8-22 (ESV)

80h, taste and see that the LORD is good! Blessed is the man who takes refuge in him!

90h, fear the LORD, you his saints, for those who fear him have no lack!

10The young lions suffer want and hunger; but those who seek the LORD lack no good thing.

11Come, O children, listen to me; I will teach you the fear of the LORD.

12What man is there who desires life and loves many days, that he may see good?

13Keep your tongue from evil and your lips from speaking deceit.

14Turn away from evil and do good; seek peace and pursue it.

15The eyes of the LORD are toward the righteous and his ears toward their cry.

16The face of the LORD is against those who do evil, to cut off the memory of them from the earth.

17When the righteous cry for help, the LORD hears and delivers them out of all their troubles.

18The LORD is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit.

19Many are the afflictions of the righteous, but the LORD delivers him out of them all.

20He keeps all his bones; not one of them is broken.

21Affliction will slay the wicked, and those who hate the righteous will be condemned.

22The LORD redeems the life of his servants; none of those who take refuge in him will be condemned.
